redshank	Kent estuary, Morecambe roosts	Year round, most in Winter
hawfinch	Sizergh Castle	Spring
heron	Main rivers	Year round

kingfisher	Main rivers – River Bela at Dellam	Spring
knot	Morecambe Stone Jetty	Year round
lapwing	Lune Estuary and Aldcliffe nature reserve	Winter/Spring
little egret	Lune Estuary and Lane End, Pilling	Year round
marsh tit	Arnside & Silverdale AONB and Sizergh in Witherslack	Spring
mute swan	Lancaster Canal	Year round
osprey	Foulshaw Moss NR, River Kent Estuary	Spring/Summer
oystercatcher	Morecambe and other estuaries and sea fronts	Year round
peregrine	Rossall Point, Humphrey Head	Spring

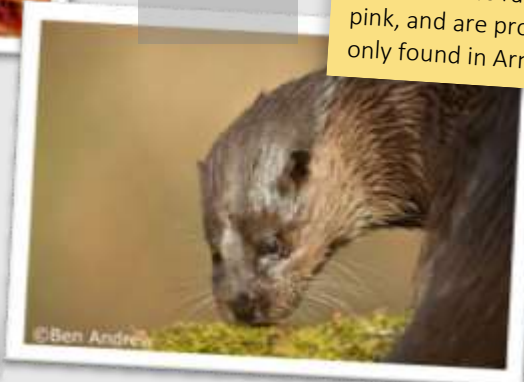
Butterflies, Moths and Dragonflies

(mostly in spring and summer, find them in bogs and mosses, and limestone grasslands and pavements)

pearl bordered fritillary	Whitbarrow NNR,	May-June

high brown fritillary	Arnside&Silverdale AONB	May-June
northern brown argus		June-July
large red damselfly	Foulshaw, Nichols, Meathop, Leighton, and Heysham Moss NRs	June- early August
brown hawker dragonfly	Foulshaw, Nichols and Meathop Moss NRs	July -August
black darter dragonfly	Roudsea Moss NNR and Winmarleigh Moss NR	July – August
white faced darter dragonfly	Foulshaw Moss NR	July - August
